

Unleash your creativity and tell your stories through the art of the written word. Creative writing is an age-old art that, like playing the guitar, can provide meaninaful and rewarding results at every level from beginner to seasoned professional. Whether your writing interests lean toward self-exploration and discovery or toward developing a deeper understanding and empathy for the human condition, this class will help you move forward on your journey. Operating in a workshop format, the class will divide its time between four general activities: discussion of key elements of good writing and storytelling; exercises that foil writer's block, spark creativity and generate ideas; writing; and peer critique sessions guided by the instructor. Students interested in any form of creative writing, from fiction to poetry to creative nonfiction and memoir, will expand their powers of observation and imagination, develop and hone their writing skills, and add focus and depth to their work in a supportive, nurturing atmosphere.

Charrie Hazard Moscardini has been a professional writer for more than thirty years. Her novel, Falling into the Sun (2009) was a 2011 Gold Recipient of the Mom's Choice Awards and a 2010 finalist in Forward Review's Book of the Year Awards. Charrie is a former program director for Life Long Writers, the membership arm of The Florida Center for Writers at the University of South Florida (USF), and has taught writing and literature at USF, St. Petersburg College, and Eckerd College. 


